Do you remember the children's song, "Here is the church! Here is the steeple! Open the doors and here's all the people."? How many of us were doing the hand motions as we were saying the words? I know I did, and I remember learning that as a child in VBS. Yet, are the words true or is there more to church than just the people? Let me ask the question differently. "What is church". Today, I want to focus on three central biblical themes of church: covenant, universal, and our mission. Claiming these three themes are important as we live into God's mission for us.

The first item is we are a **covenant** community. In other words, God initiates this covenant with us. Beginning with Adam and Eve, we read in the entire sweep of scripture, and we come to understand that God loves us with steadfast faithfulness and God calls us into community. This is how God works. God works in and through community. Embedded in Godself is the Trinity. Three persons but one God. The only way this relationship works is in community. And so, God works with us, too. In Jeremiah 31, we read of how our God promises to write a new and better covenant on the hearts of God's people. We believe that this promise is fulfilled in God sending his only Son Christ, Jesus the Christ.

We specifically see this call to community connected the Lord's Table, where we eat and commune with one another and with God. In the breaking of the one bread and sharing from the one cup, we discover that Church isn't just "a good thing to do." Our call as a covenant community is to experience God's love, to remember we are God's chosen children, and to remember to treat others as God's children too around the Lord's Table.

We also are a **universal** church. Universal is interesting; what does it mean? For those of us in the traditional service, the word "catholic" is used to mean universal. For universal relates to two key concepts of our diversity and Kairos time. Galatians reminds us, "For there is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." Universal reminds us that the church is beyond race, creed, or gender. We are all one and invited to come as the song says, "Just as I am."

Universal also points us beyond the present (Chronos or temporal) into the realm of the eternal - Kairos. The covenant God's establishes in our Baptism binds us with "the Great Cloud of Witnesses." All past, present, and future believers (i.e., communion of saints) are our brothers and sisters. These "Great Cloud of Witnesses" are with us and part of our gathering in the name of Christ. All the saints of different nations relate to us in a special way by virtue of the covenant relationship we share. We may be divided by language, geography, and political leanings, yet we are essentially one in our faith in Christ which is both diverse and eternal.

Now, let's discuss the church's **mission**. Matthew ends his gospel with our challenge to, "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20). Our mission is quite simply to make God's love known to the world by making disciples. The Great Commission was given to us to spread the good news that "the world may see (our) good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (5:16). The world is watching us – noticing our actions and listening to our words.

Those items – covenant, universal, and mission – come together to form our identity as a church. We are a people of a powerful covenant expressed in our Baptism. We are a diverse people who are joined around the Lord's Table with the Community of Saints. We are a church that offers the world our spotlight of faith with God's message of hope. See you in church.

Stephen Ministry is a way our church provides care to hurting people in our congregation and community.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a hurting person --- men are paired with men, women with women --- and talks weekly with that person to listen, care, pray, and encourage.

Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and many other life difficulties. Many of us are dealing with several of these trials right now.
