I love birthdays! I love the cards, the balloons, the birthday meal, the singing of the birthday song, the presents, and most of all the vanilla cake with butter cream icing. The first Sunday in June (June 5) we celebrate a rather important birthday for us as a community of faith – Pentecost – which is the birthday of the church.

Recall, at the Day of Pentecost the early church experienced the birth as the Spirit of God filling the Apostles. Today, that same Spirit fills our church universal giving it power and purpose. Yet, has anyone ever seen the Spirit? No! Yet, we experience evidence of the Spirit's presence. To be frank, the Spirit is somewhat elusive. Many of the early church desert fathers talked of the spirit as breath or wind. Acts offers us the image of flames of fire. For us to understand God's Spirit and what God's Spirit does, we must use poetic words: Spirit of Gentleness; Spirit of restlessness; whispering Spirit in the silent places; Spirit of vision; Spirit of justice; Spirit of peace; Spirit who heals.

Pentecost's origins are rooted in the Hebrew community before the Bible was written. In the beginning, the "Spirit of God" moved over the face of the waters adding form and shape to the formless and void. The ancient Hebrews celebrated the beginning of their harvest season with this Pentecost festival, rejoicing over the fertility of the land. After the deliverance from slavery in Egypt, the harvest festival was replaced with the Passover Feast. But the harvest motif remained in place with the celebration of the *conclusion* of harvest in the "week of weeks" on the fiftieth day after the Passover, thus "Pentecost" in Greek simply means "the fiftieth day" after Passover. Thus, the Day of Pentecost is forever connected with our Jewish brothers and sisters' Passover celebration.

The Hebrews later added new meaning to Pentecost by associating it with the giving of the Law of God to Moses at Mount Sinai. This event is the highpoint of the Old Testament and defines the Jewish people as "People of the Law."

The Acts of the Apostles records that on Pentecost, God's Spirit filled the Apostles with a **power** not known to them before, they began to carry out what Jesus instructed them to do. They built up a new community of faith - "the body of Christ" or commonly called the one holy, catholic (i.e., universal) and apostolic church. What lies at the core of Pentecost? Let me use three "C" words that are descriptive of how Pentecost challenges and changes us.

<u>Community, communication, and communion</u> are three words that share the same root: the Latin word *communis*. These three words describe a church. The word's intent is to facilitate communication and connection in our community.

We are a community. In other words, despite all the various parts and varied membership, we are all one body. Through the Spirit we are individual members, we are one body! Paul uses this organic nature of a body to remind us how important we are all to one another and no one part is greater than another. If something affects one part of us, the whole body is affected.

We are also in need of good communication. At the Tower of Babel, the world was dispersed by God and languages divided us from each other. Yet, at Pentecost's moment everyone gathered in Acts heard and understood one another in their language. In Acts 2:9 we read: "Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia" gathered in one place to celebrate the moment and rejoiced in being able to finally understand one another. What was divided at Babel was rejoined that important day. Thus, we are to remember to listen to one another and rejoice in our unity.

We also are to be in communion with each other. The Lord's table celebrates our connection with God and with each other. We eat with one another and share with each other as reminders of the great feast Gods' prepared for us through the body and blood of our Lord.

In this season of Pentecost, we celebrate the Holy Spirit, whose initial manifestation was to guide and assist the apostles, the first Christian community, in connecting a community with each other, communicating unity with one another, and the communion of believers in Christ. Together let us seek God's help in a new way to share Gods word and Gods love among ourselves and others.


