Several years ago, the kids and I went to Florida over Christmas break. While we were there, we visited a friend's farm. We enjoyed a fun evening of food, fellowship, and a bonfire. Jordan and Kara laughed and played hard. At the end of the day, they were tired from all the physical exertion. I love seeing them laugh and play together and this farm is a safe place for them to explore being kids. The main reason for us to go to this place was for the kids to see the chrysalis of the Monarch butterfly. It is utterly amazing to see the caterpillars transform into the wonder of the butterfly. I

have seen cocoons in the past, but this time was different. I remember being caught in a new way thinking about the events going on hidden inside the chrysalis.

Some cocoons were already opened. Others were dark, indicating the caterpillar died in its struggle for freedom. I also noticed other chrysalises where the transformation was still taking place. Those were especially interesting to me, and I left the farm pondering the caterpillar's struggle. That night I surfed the web to remind myself of transformation process from a caterpillar to a beautiful butterfly. Here is what I learned.

Caterpillars are fascinating insects. They eat and eat and eat. They live to eat. At just the right time, the caterpillars stop their crawling, eating, and chewing, attach their tails firmly to a stick and lay still making the cocoon by sheathing itself with a shiny leather-like case. For weeks they seem dead, unmoving in their tiny gray wrappings. When the time is right, they are ready to immerge.

What we saw on the farm was the internal struggle of the caterpillar to free itself of the bondage. We witnessed the struggle for freedom as it struggled inside the encasing until suddenly what binds them is split open. What we witnessed at the farm was a true miracle. A splendid butterfly emerged and stood for hours gently moving its wings, pumping fluids into them to extend them fully. When the process was complete, the butterfly soared gracefully away on the breezes of the wind, leaving nothing behind but a broken chrysalis to indicate its former bondage.

During this season of Lent, we are encouraged to travel inward pondering the weight of what a life lived in Christ offers us. The butterfly's struggle with the cocoon reminds us of the power of the resurrection. The early church chooses as a symbol of the church the butterfly for a reason. That transformative struggle reminds us of the empty grave clothes of our risen Lord. When Peter and John heard the news of the empty tomb and the Lord's body was gone, they ran all the way from their lodging to the graveside. Peter entered the tomb and the wrappings that bound Jesus in death were seen folded and separate from the linen covering his body (John 20:6-7, NIV). They were laid carefully on the ground reminding us of the once shrouded corpse which is now emerged in new life.

Through Christ's death and resurrection our bondage to death is broken. Continue this season of Lent by traveling inward through our worship services. On Easter morning we can look forward to proclaiming with a loud voice, "Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed!"

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a way our church provides care to hurting people in our congregation and community.

Stephen Ministers are congregation members who have gone through 50 hours of training to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. Each Stephen Minister is matched with a hurting person --- men are paired with men, women with women --- and talks weekly with that person to listen, care, pray, and encourage.

Stephen Ministers care for those dealing with grief, divorce, job loss, hospitalization, financial struggles, loneliness, convalescence, terminal illness, and many other life difficulties. Many of us are dealing with several of these trials right now.
